The site is located in the center of the town of Monoszló, Hungary, not far from the local Reform Church and the adjacent to the well-known Erdei School. It is customary in the area to build with minimal front yards, or no front yard at all, and extended eaves.

This rural, tile-roofed, stone-walled adobe house was reconstructed avoiding new functions, structures and materials, alien to the original use of the house. Newer urban patterns, appearing in the region mainly due to changing ownership, were considered as potential threats in this context.

Next to the existing reconstructed house a perpendicular extension was built on the area where some old sheds used to stand. This extension houses the sun-room/kitchen and was designed to meet modern day standards using the most contemporary technologies, materials and construction methods. The new does not want to transform the old and did not come into existence to replace it, but rather to complete it.

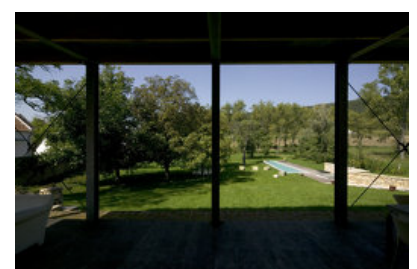
